## Planting Guide for Poor Draining Soil (Clay Soil)

## WHAT YOU'LL NEED:

- Organic Mushroom Compost
- Bio-Tone Root Starter

## SUCCESSFUL PLANTING FOR OUTDOOR SHRUBS AND TREES:

- 1. Dig hole 2x as wide and half the depth of the rootball.
- 2. *Place* Bio-Tone Root Starter in the bottom of the hole.
- 3. Remove plant from its pot and loosen its roots.
- 4. *Place plant* in the hole directly on top of the Bio-Tone so the top of the rootball is 1/3 above ground level.
- 5. *Fill* around the rootball with your soil and organic compost firmly patting the soil around the rootball. Additional soil will be needed to cover the sides of the exposed rootball.
- 6. Water thoroughly. Make a temporary ring of soil outside of the root-ball to create a "donut" to hold water. Fill "donut" 3x allowing water to soak in. New plantings need regular deep watering. See watering guide for specific recommendations.
- 7. *Mulch* with a 3" layer of bark mulch or pine straw. Keep a few inches away from the trunk and spread 2-3 feet beneath the plant to hold in moisture and reduce weeds.
- 8. Keep your plant well fed by using Espoma Plant-Tone or Holly-Tone as directed.
